THE HONORABLE GERALD W. HEANEY*

I value every day of my association with Judge McMillian on the United States Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit, in particular, the times we sat together on the St. Louis and Kansas City school cases. The experience and knowledge that he brought to those cases was exceptional.
